## Common Colon

In this Lesson, you will review and develop understanding of the proper way to use colons.

Colons are actually used for several different reasons. One of the most popular ways to use a colon is to separate a series clause from a complete sentence.

### For Example:

I'm going to the store to buy three things: lipstick, a toothbrush, and some dental floss.

There are many things that you can do to help ensure that you get a better night's sleep: eat a healthy diet, avoid caffeine, and don't drink too many fluids before bed.



You can also use a colon to complete a thought.

### For Example:

There is only one person I trust with my money: my brother.

The delinquent student didn't notice who was watching her: the teacher.

Also, a colon is used to separate many things such as a title and subtitle, minutes from the hour when telling time, and in many citations.
